## IS MY CHILD GIFTED? CHARACTERISTICS OF GIFTED LEARNERS



Both parents and educators know that all children have special talents, but it can be difficult to determine whether a child is a bright, hardworking student who is being challenged effectively within his/her learning environment, or a gifted child who would benefit from a more specialized learning environment like SAA. The following table of characteristics is helpful in distinguishing between bright children and gifted learners. It is important to remember that because gifted children are so diverse, not all of them will exhibit all of these characteristics, nor will they demonstrate them all of the time.

Copies accurately	Creates a new design

Good memorizer	Good guesser
Enjoys stratightforward presentation	Thrives on complexity
Is alert	Is keenly observant
